BIG PROFIT IN CRANBERRIES

C. W. Gibbs Gets \$3725.00 Off Six Acres on North Inlet This Year.

C. W. Gibbs, who last season purchased part of the McFarlin cranberry ranch on North Inlet, was in Marshfield today preparing to take the Redondo tomorrow for his old home in Sunnyvale, Calif., where he will spend the winter.

He reports a very successful season, having one of the best cranberry crops in years. They are now selling for about \$5 per box. He will take the season crop, 765 boxes, to the San Francisco market with him. This is the product of six acres, or about \$620 per acre for one year.

PAROLES PORTLAND BANKER.

W. Cooper Morris Freed by Governor West.

SALEM, Ore., Nov. 20.—Governor West has granted a parole to W. Cooper Morris, the Portland banker who was serving an indeterminate sentence of one to ten years in state prison for larceny by embezzlement from the old Oregon Trust and Savings Bank.

For several months Morris has been working with the prison "honor" gang on the Steel Rock road, near Hood River, and at this time he has not been notified that he is free so long as he keeps the covenants of his parole.
