sume the old wharfage charge on freight in and out over the city dock. This charge was taken off last summer when it was expected that active railroad construction would start soon. It was abolished as a special inducement to the con-tractors and the Southern Pacific to handle their stuff through North Bend. The inducement failed to hasten the work and the current business in and out over wharf is wearing it considerable, requiring the expenditure of quite a sum by the city to keep it in repair. Also, the Washington recently unloaded a large amount of lumber on it, when she had to discharge her cargo to go to Portland for repairs, and this load will do between \$200 and \$400 damage to the wharf, it is estimated.

There was an informal discussion of North Bend politics before the regular business session. All the old city officials with the exception Treasurer C. S. Winsor will be candidates for re-election. It is undestood that Major Kinney will not enter the race for councilmen. will probably result in tickets in the field, the Socialists and the Citizens' tickets. J. H. Greves will be a candidate for treasurer in place of Mr. Winsor.
