Crape Paper Gifts Are Popular This Year

Crape paper rope work has proved to be a most popular and fascinating feature of paper art, and many girls are making some of their Christmas gifts from this rope material. The following instructions may guide the uninitiated in this work: For one-half inch rope cut a roll of crape paper through the center. Fasten one end to the drawer or tie it to some object; then walk away with the other end, stretching it to its greatest possible length.



VASE OF CRAPE PAPER.

Form a loop in the end of the crape and insert a pencil. Grasp the pencil at the lower edge with the right hand, steadying the strip of paper with the left hand, twist the pencil from you with a wrist motion until the crape is tight and firm. Now fasten the end to something so it will not untwist. Twist a second strand in the same way and then attach both ends in the same way at the same point. Twist the two strands together by turning the pencil in the opposite direction, toward the left.

To fashion the very good looking vase illustrated all one has to do is to wrap the pasteboard foundation with the paper rope.
