SAYS COUPLE CAN LIVE
WELL ON \$15 A WEEK

Boston Clergyman Tells How Comfortable Home Can Be Maintained.

BOSTON, Nov. 28.—Rev. H. H. Johnson, of the big Clarendon Baptist Church, believes that a couple can marry and live comfortably on \$15 a week.

"They can go to the suburbs," he said, "and find a good three or four-room apartment for \$4 a week. Excellent food for two need not cost more than \$4 a week. Dress should not require more than \$50 a year. One dollar week should always be saved for emergencies. This leaves sufficient for light and fuel, carfare, a small sum for the church and a dollar two a week for recreation and other items."

PUT POWDER IN HIS STOVE

The Coquille Herald says:

On Tuesday morning Mr. Arneson called at the real estate office of C. E. Niles and informed that gentleman dealer in lands and lots of an expeditious and admirable way of removing soot from stovepipe and chimney. The stove not working properly, Mr. Niles gladly applied the antidote to remove the clogged condition—and the work was performed instantaneously.

The real estate man was told to put powder in the stove while a fire was burning therein and the unwellcome, tenacious substance would be blown skyward. Accordingly, one-fourth pound of powder was purchased from a merchant and applied according to instruction.

"No damage other than the loss of a stove pipe and a genial countenance covered with soot and a dire surprise, both of which were quickly renewed and are now performing the usual functions.

600,000 DOUGLAS FIR TREE TO BE PLANTED

PORTLAND, Ore., Nov. 28.—Six hundred thousand Douglas fir trees, six to eight inches high and over a year old, are being sent to the slopes of the Coast Range in the Siuslaw national forest from the government nursery near Carson for reforestation purposes. The trees, which are being sent out in 10 lots of 60,000 each, are being planted, a thousand to the acre, six feet apart each way, on burned over tracts. The planting will last most of the winter. Planted a thousand to the acre may seem to be very close, but in the struggle for existence, the government knows that only a hundred of the trees will reach maturity.
