That Eureka, within the next five years will become the central point in a network of railroads which will cover northwestern Californa, is now assured beyond all doubt.

The construction of a railroad from Medford, Oregon, to Crescent City now appears certain, as indicated by a dispatch form Crescent while the construction of a coast railroad from Eureka to Coos bay via Crescent City has been assured for some time.

It is now an established fact that within two years at the latest, Eureka and San Francisco will be linked by the Northwestern Pacific.
