SAN FRANCISCO, Dec. 3.—The full-rigged American steel ship *Erskine M. # HOBBLE SKIRTS 5,000 YEARS AGO

Excavations in Crete Reveal Mannish Collars and Tight Corsets.

PHILADELPHIA, Dec. 3.—The hobble skirt is more than 5000 years old, according to Dr. Edith Hall, who has charge of the excavations in Crete for the University of Pennsylvania, and is here to deliver a course of lectures. In her opening lecture, Dr. Hall declared that the excavations so far made show that the women of those days, 3000 years before Christ, wore hobble skirts, tight corsets and mannish collars.

"Excavations on the island," said Dr. Hall, "will be materially assisted by the Balkan war, since under the Turkish regime the excavating is hampered by a great deal of red tape."

# INCOME TAX IS DEFEATED

Error in Baker County Changes the Result.

A Salem paper says that the income tax amendment to the constitution lost instead of having carried, as previous reports would indicate, is shown by official figures received here for all but Malheur county. The amendment will lose by about 300 votes, the returns from Malheur county, it is certain, not being able to overcome this lead of the negative vote.

An error of 500 votes in the affirmative returns from Baker county is responsible for the change. These figures on the amendment are compiled after corrections have been made by the secretary of state on all returns except those from Multnomah county, the figures on Multnomah county being those returned by the canvassing board.

Ten of the 37 measures submitted in the general election have been in doubt.

Woman suffrage, which gives the ballot to women in Oregon who are 21 years old and who are American citizens, Carried by 3277.

Eight hours constitute a day's work on public works. How far this law reaches has not been determined. Carried by 16,406.

Regulating freight rates. It is a complicated matter which even the experts have been unable to fathom yet. Carried by 13,514.

The county single tax option was repealed. It was never in effect, but was adopted under the Initiative, so the experiment could be tried, and now it is wiped off the books. Carried by 17,514.

Convicts cannot be farmed out hereafter to stove manufacturers or other private concerns, but they can be worked on the highways. Carried by 36,051.

County and city prisoners can be used in road work. Heretofore there has been some question as to who controlled the prisoners and what could be done with them. Carried by 33,320.

Stockholders in banks are held liable to pay for the benefit of depositors an amount equal to the par value of the stock they hold, in addition to having paid originally the par value of the stock. It is a double liability for bank stockholders. Carried by 61,082.

The state is limited to 2 per cent of the assessed valuation for raising funds for road work. Carried by 15,732.

Counties are limited to 2 per cent of their assessed valuation for road improvements. Carried by 12,628.

All public service corporations, such as the street railways, light, power, telephone and water companies are subject to regulation by the state Railroad Commission. Carried by 20,889.

Tax exemption on household goods in actual use. Carried by 7326.
