## PLAN TO LEAVE SOON FOR EAST

Coos Bay Delegation to Start for Washington About January 1.

While the exact date of the departure of the Coos Bay delegation for Washington has not been fixed, it is expected that they will leave about January 1.

Capt. Macgenn is having plans made to get away then. It is expected that Capt. H. C. Nelson, formerly of the Nann Smith and M. F. Plant will be here soon from San Francisco to take Capt. Macgenn's place on the Breakwater, during his absence in Washington. Capt. Nelson is well known here as one of the best navigators that Coos Bay has ever had.

Additional blue prints showing the soundings taken by Engineer Charleston in his new survey of the Coos Bay bar, are being made so that the committee will have ample to explain the situation at Washington.

Capt. Macgenn has written Senator Perkins of California to assist the Coos Bay delegation in getting recognition for Coos Bay. Senator Perkins was for nearly forty years the active head of the Goodall-Perkins company, the most successful steamship company on the Coast. As a member of it, he at one time had extensive holdings here in the Libby mine and Oregon Coal and Navigation company holdings, now known as the Reynolds Development Company tract, and operated the M. F. Plant and other vessels in here for awhile. He always has been a friend of Coos Bay. Capt. Macgenn formerly ran on the Goodall-Perkins vessels, having received his first appointment direct from Senator Perkins 24 years ago. Frank Pixley, then editor of the Argonaut, introducing the two. Senator Perkins is chairman of the Naval Board and has always occupied an important place in the government rivers and harbors work.

## PLAN TO GROW LOGANBERRIES

Coos Bay Fruit Growers Association Formed to Promote Industry.

As a means of developing the fruit industry around Coos Bay, the Coos Bay Fruit Growers Association has just been organized. It is planned to handle the business on a cooperative basis, in planting, growing and marketing.

The association has been incorporated with a capital stock of \$5,000. The incorporators are G. Gilbertson, George Cantine, S. W. Harmon, D. D. Brainard, A. O. Kjelland and A. G. Raab. The stock will be made payable in fruit instead of cash.

One of the first things to be taken up will be to develop the loganberry culture. It is declared that this section is especially adapted to the growth of the loganberry and there is always a good market for it. An average crop with a minimum price of four cents per pound, which the new association is talking of guaranteeing, it is estimated that an acre should produce \$500 worth in a year.

It is proposed to put in a fruit dryer and ship direct to eastern markets, thus insuring the greatest possible returns. A. O. Kjelland has given the matter considerable study and is enthusiastic over the prospects. He is endeavoring to have many ranchers plant the loganberry vines this fall and winter. The hill and bench lands are said to be especially good for loganberry crops.

## DAY'S DOINGS IN CONGRESS

San Francisco Wants \$500,000 Appropriation for a Marine Hospital.

(By Associated Press to Coos Bay Times.) WASHINGTON, Dec. 13.—The adjournment of congress for the Christmas holidays, December 19 to January 2, was authorized today when the senate adopted the resolution already passed by the house.

(By Associated Press to Coos Bay Times.) WASHINGTON, Dec. 13.—The Senate today resumed consideration of the omnibus claims bill and the court impeachment in the Archbald case continued its work.

The house considered private pension legislation. Representative introduced a resolution calling for a report of the investigation into the Peruvian rubber atrocities.

Representative Kahn urged the public buildings committee provide \$500,000 for a marine hospital at San Francisco.

Readjustment of the patent fee system is proposed in a bill introduced by Representative Oldfield.

Consideration of the Indian appropriation bill was resumed.
