BIG FORCE ON PANAMA CANAL

Employment Roll at End of November Had 40,159 Men On It.

COLON, Dec. 13.—The largest force ever engaged at one time in the construction of the Panama Canal was working at the end of November, when 40,159 men, of whom 5,816 were American citizens, were employed. No fewer than 4000 are engaged on the lock gates.

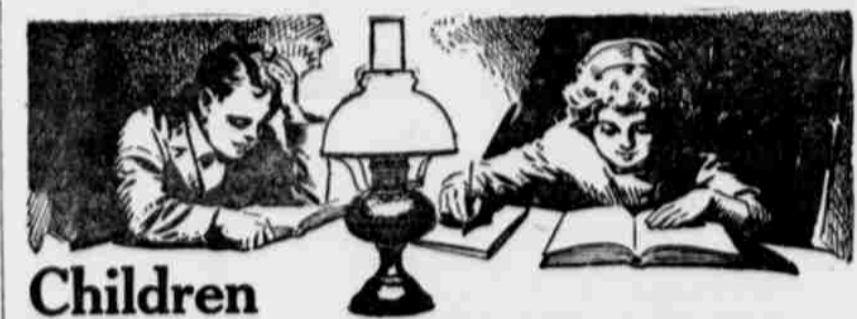
