## WOULD FLY TO NORTH POLE

Bartlett Says Aeroplane Route Is Easiest Way to Get There.

BOSTON, Mass., Dec. 24.—"The safest and easiest way to reach the North Pole and an entirely feasible way, is by aeroplane," says Capt. A. Bartlett of the Peary North Pole party, to the members of the Aero Club of New England at its annual dinner.

Captain Bartlett said an aeroplane could be taken by land to Cape Morris K. Jessup, which is 381 miles from the pole. With the latest machine this would mean only a four hours' flight to the pole, he said. The ice would furnish suitable landing places all along the route, but all necessary supplies would have to be carried to and from the pole.

"The ideal trip," said the speaker, "would be to go from Cape Jessup directly over to the pole and land at Cape Chelluskin in Siberia, the latter point, however, being 720 miles beyond the pole. In July and August the conditions are perfect for flying and I can see no serious difficulties which might not be guarded against."

### MASHER IS ARRESTED.

A Chorus Girl Objects to Being Hugged.

SIOUX CITY, Ia., Dec. 24.—C. Nugent of this city has discovered a chorus girl who doesn't care to be squeezed—not by him, at any rate. Nugent was waiting at the stage door of the New Grand when Flora Lamont of a comic opera stepped out. Putting his arms around her, he whispered endearing phrases, to which she replied with vigorous shrieks from a healthy pair of lungs. A policeman appeared and Nugent paid a fine of \$25 in police court.

### THURNE IS REFUSED.

Prince Regent of Bavaria Refuses Tender of Mad Otto's Crown. (By Associated Press to Coos Bay Times.) MUNICH, Bavaria, Dec. 23.—Prince Ludwig, the new prince regent of Bavaria, has sent an autograph letter to the Bavarian premier vetoing the movement to place him on the throne as king in place of Mad King Otto.

KANSAS CITY, Mo., Dec. 24.—Men with blue eyes make the most unreliable husbands, according to statistics compiled by E. J. Fleming, superintendent of the Kansas City free legal aid bureau.

### Austria Also Agrees.

Finally Accepts European Peace Proposed Today. (By Associated Press to Coos Bay Times.) LONDON, Dec. 23.—Further relaxation of the international tension was brought today when Austria-Hungary informed the other European powers that she considers Balkan difficulties approaching satisfactory solution.
