Solomon must have had the Bible in mind when he uttered his famous complaint that of the making of books there was no end. Notwithstanding the millions of new books annually published throughout the world, the bible still leads them all. the presses. The one issued under the auspices of the American Baptist Publication Society is one of these. It contains variations from both the Authorized and revised versions, which the translaters have made in behalf of greater accuracy. Nevertheless, there are many gray headed men and women who will find it difficult to make such changes as for example the one in the Lord's Prayer: "Deliver us from the evil one;" instead of the old time 'Deliver us from evil." all of these changes have long been known to students of the bible, and for the most part can be found in the marginal readings of one version or the other; nevertheless, it is all to the greater glory of God.

The other bible is from the press of C. Wilderman Company, and bears the imprimatur of Cardinal Farley and Archbishop Prendergast. an attractively bound, beautifully printed edition of the scholarly Douay of the Roman Catholic Church, It will come somewhat as a surprise to people who have all their lives held to the popular idea that the Roman Church discouraged the reading of the bible, to read the quotaton which prefaces the New Testament: "An indulgence of 300 days is granted to all the Faithful who read the Holy Gospels at least a quarter of an hour. A Plenary Indulgence under the usual conditions is granted once a month for the daily reading."

Surely, the more knowledge the various Christian Churches have of the bible, the broader will be their tolerance, and the greater unity will characterize their labors in the build-ing up of the Kingdom.
