CHILDREN ARE SAVED BY DOG

Scotch Collies Perform Unusual Feats in Colorado.

TRINIDAD, Colo., Jan. 11.—Fighting to the death, a Scotch collie dog saved the lives of his two masters, Louis and Samuel Salverno, 10 and 12 years old, respectively, who were attacked by three hunger crazed coyotes on the snow-clad plains, ten miles southwest of here yesterday. The boys were badly bitten by the infuriated beasts, and their clothes were practically torn to ribbons. The dog was so badly decorated is dying, but succeeded in killing two and driving off the other coyote.

A shepherd dog saved the lives of two infant children of Nels Zurta late last night after a cat had knocked a lighted lamp from a table to the bed, in which the two babies were sleeping. The dog, which had been left on duty by Mrs. Zurta, who was taking her husband's lunch to 15m, pulled the blazing cover from the bed and dragged it into another room.

ANIMAL DIES OF BROKEN HEART

DISABLED MULE, SEEING ANOTHER ON HIS OLD JOB, DIES OF BROKEN HEART.

LAWRENCEBURG, Ind., Jan. 11.—Old Cuba, a mule owned by the People's Coal Company and said by George Kunz to have done service in the Spanish-American war in Cuba, died on the river bank, apparently from a broken heart from grief due to the loss of his job. The mule had been used by the coal company to pull a cable from the power house to the coal boats on the Ohio river.

A few days ago the mule became lame and was placed in a pasture across the river in Kentucky.

He broke through the fence, swam the river and returned to the power house, and, seeing another mule in his harness attacked the animal. Kunz prevented Old Cuba from killing the new mule.

Going to the coal float, Old Cuba looked back at his rival, uttered a mournful bray, and fell dead. A veterinarian who examined the mule's body pronounced death due to heart trouble.

TELLS OF DEATH.

Further Particulars of Death of Mother of W. C. Bradley of Marshfield.

Saturday's Portland Oregonian contains the following concerning the death of the mother of W. C. Bradley, mention of which was made in the Time last week:

"Mrs. Helen M. Bradley, 75 years old, mother of Herbert Bradley, of the Herbert Bradley Shoe Company, Willis Bradley of Marshfield, Or., and Dr. Hubbard Bradley, of Bay City, Mich., died yesterday at her home, 463 Tenth street, of carcinoma. The funeral will be held this morning at the Portland Crematorium.

"Mrs. Bradley was born in Syracuse, N. Y., and came to Oregon 28 years ago, after passing several years in Cedar Rapids, Ia. She was prominently connected with the First Presbyterian Church. Up to the time of her death she was in good health and retained her faculties well. Besides her sons, Mrs. Bradley had two daughters, one of whom died in infancy, and the other in Oregon several years ago."
