### CURRY COUNTY IS UP IN ARMS

**Strong Resolution Demanding Open-  
ing of Forest Reserve Are Adopted.**

**GOLD BEACH, Ore., Feb. 17.**—  
The following resolutions were adop-  
ted at the last meeting of the Curry  
County Commercial Club.  
Whereas, the total area of Curry  
County is 958,720 acres and 598,007  
acres of this area is in the forest re-  
serve, or over five ninths of the area  
of the whole county, and

Whereas, the said reserve is a detri-  
ment to all the people who live in  
the county; all kinds of natural re-  
sources are withheld from use; the  
reserve being operated to help the  
big capitalist and being a detriment  
to the home builder; the conduct of  
the officers in charge of the reserve  
being bigoted, high handed and with-  
out authority of law, their uniform  
conduct toward settlers who have at-  
tempted to settle within the reserve,  
a systematic harassing of settlers,  
bringing charges against them with-  
out an opportunity to be heard, and  
in one instance forging a settler's  
name, which technically made him  
appear to be a criminal, taking land  
away from actual settlers for so-  
called ranger stations, reporting ad-  
versely on all claims and annoying  
the settlers in every manner possi-  
ble, and whereas the forest reserve  
stops settlement and improvement,  
reducing the amount of taxes for  
schools and roads which are greatly  
needed for the upbuilding of the  
county, and

Whereas, Curry County is losing  
\$30,000 per year in taxes that would  
be paid in to the county if the re-  
serve is thrown open to settlement,  
and

Whereas, the unbearable tyranny  
of all officers connected with the  
forest reserve, from the secretary of  
the interior to the lowest menial is un-  
worthy of and in direct contraven-  
tion to the spirit of a free country.  
Therefore, be it resolved by the  
Curry County Commercial Club that  
it is for the best interests of Curry  
County and the state of Oregon, that  
all national forest reserves within  
the county of Curry be thrown open  
to homestead and timber applica-  
tions.  
And be it further resolved that we  
send a copy of these resolutions to all  
members of congress from Oregon  
and to the United States Senators  
for Oregon, and that they shall use  
their best endeavors to have said na-  
tional forests in Curry County, Ore-  
gon, thrown open for settlement.  
Adopted by unanimous vote Febru-  
ary 8, 1913. By George D. Wood,

secretary.

**Miss Eloise Nye Awarded Prize for  
Art Design in Portland.**  
A Portland paper says:  
"Miss Eloise Nye, who was an-  
nounced as the winner of the \$25

pupil in the Portland Art associa-
