LOSE LIVES IN TRIP TO POLE

Two Members of English Expedition to Southern Magnetic Pole Die.

SYDNEY, N. S. W., Feb. 25.—Two members of the Mawson Antarctic expedition, Lieut. Ninnis, an Englishman, and Dr. Mertz, Swiss, have died.

The party left Tasmania in 1911 accompanied by a large body of scientific men to explore thoroughly the regions around the Southern magnetic pole.

Once again the British army is affected by the loss of a brilliant officer, Lieut. B. E. S. Ninnis of the famous Royal Fusiliers regiment, a close friend of Captain Lawrence Oakes of the Inniskilling Dragoons, who perished with Capt. Scott.

SALVATION ARMY PRIZE.

MEXICO CITY, Feb. 25.—A revival of the Diaz influence in Mexico is indicated by an order issued by Provisional President Huerta today that all portraits of the former president, Porfirio Diaz, be restored to places in public buildings from which they were removed by Madero.
