## WILSON FAMILY WILL BE THERE

TWENTY-SIX RELATIVES OF THE PRESIDENT-ELECT TO ATTEND INAUGURATION NEXT WEEK AT WASHINGTON.

PRINCETON, N. J., Feb. 25.—Mrs. Woodrow Wilson today announced the personnel of the Wilson family party to be present at the inauguration in Washington. The list of invited guests, aside from the five members of the President-elect's own family, includes 21 relatives as follows:

The President-elect's brother, Joseph R. Wilson, Mrs. Wilson and daughter, of Nashville; the President-elect's sister, Mrs. Annie Howe, of Philadelphia; Mrs. Wilson's brother, Prof. Stockton Axson of Princeton; the President-elect's cousin, John Wilson and family of four, of Franklin, Pa.; Wilson Howe, son of Mrs. Annie Howe, and Mrs. Howe, of Washington; George Howe, another son of Mrs. Howe, of Columbia, S. C.; Mrs. Perrin Cothran, daughter of Mrs. Howe, of Raleigh, N. C.; the President-elect's aunt, Mrs. Thomas Woodrow, of Denver; the President-elect's cousins, Mrs. James Woodrow, and her daughter and two sons, of Columbia, S. C.; and another cousin, Miss Helen Woodrow Bones of Rome, Ga.

The relatives are to gather at the Shoreham in Washington late in the afternoon on March 3, where John Wilson will act as the host at a reception to the President-elect and his immediate family. There will be a dinner and the family gathering will spend the evening together and attend the ceremonies if inauguration in a body in the executive gallery of the Senate; lunch at the White House will follow, after which the parade will be viewed from the President's stand in front of the White House.

## MISS ETHEL TO BE WED SOON

COL. AND MRS. ROOSEVELT ANNOUNCE ENGAGEMENT OF DAUGHTER TO DR. RICHARD DERRY OF NEW YORK.

NEW YORK, Feb. 25.—Colonel and Mrs. Theodore Roosevelt have made known to their relatives and intimate friends the engagement of their second daughter, Miss Ethel Carew Roosevelt, to Dr. Richard Derby, a son of the late Dr. Richard H. Derby of this city. Formal announcement of the engagement is to be made within a few days.

Miss Roosevelt holds the unique distinction of having spent more years in the White House than any young person before her. She made her debut in society at a ball in the White House in December, 1908. Her coming marriage, for which the date has not been selected as yet, will be of widespread social importance.

Doctor Derby is a graduate of Harvard, class of 1903, and is a young practicing physician in this city. His father was a well known eye specialist, a graduate of Harvard in 1867, and whose death occurred on July 4, 1907, at his summer home at Dark Harbor, Me. He has two brothers, James Lloyd Derby and Roger A. Derby, who is now at Jackson Springs, N. C.

Miss Roosevelt has been in New York society since leaving the White House, attending many of the affairs given by the younger set. Although she has spent most of her time with her parents at Sagamore Hill at Oyster Bay, L. I., her home life has tended to the development of all that simple, sweet and wholesome and in personal appearance she is very attractive.

Like her father, she is an ardent devotee of outdoor sports and exercise, being, of course, an expert horse woman. She loves a good horse, and at times has displayed great courage and daring in mounting a steed known to be unmanageable.

When Ethel Roosevelt entered the White House she was a little girl in abbreviated dresses and "pig tails." In 1908 she emerged from the school room as "Miss Roosevelt," to take her place in the round of summer gaities, a demure, self-possessed society belle.

Miss Ethel is not of the same figure as her half-sister, Alice Roosevelt Longworth. She is shorter and of a larger frame. Her coloring is similar, but of more positive shadings. Her hair is a little darker, her eyes bluer, and the color of lips and cheeks more intense.

In 1909 friends of Miss Roosevelt expected the announcement of her engagement to William Phillips of Boston, who at that time was third assistant secretary of state. The announcement was not made.

### CITRUS LOSS MINIMIZED.

Scientists Say Three-Fourths of the Trees Will Bear Again. BERKELEY, Cal., Feb. 26.—That the loss of fruits in the Southern California citrus belt through the recent frosts was not as great as at first supposed was the report made by University of California scientists who are in the south with an agricultural department demonstration train. The report says that frozen oranges are harmless, provided the evaporation of the juice has not advanced too far. The scientists found that at least three-fourths of the trees will do as well next year as ever.
