

# SOLDIER HOME TO BE AIDED

### LEGISLATURE APPROPRIATES \$32,000 FOR ADDITION TO THE ROSEBURG INSTITUTION — OTHER LEGISLATIVE NEWS.

SALEM, Feb. 26.—A fight over the insertion of items not germane to the subject was made in the House when the ways and means committee sent in its recommendation for the Soldiers' Home at Roseburg, a total of \$32,000. The bill was finally passed.

The House passed Senate bill 145 by Bean, providing for the protection of game birds. Nichols, who is a farmer, declared that the sportsmen had, when before committee, conceded many things to the farmers, and that he was well pleased with it. Nichols said that the sportsmen had asked for consideration only in sections relating to the hunting of ducks. He asserted that it was the most favorable game law from the standpoint of the farmers ever passed in the state.

The bill for a state industrial home for girls and women went through the House and was passed by a vote of 39 to 2. The bill appropriates \$50,000 for the two-year term, which is to be used in establishing and maintaining the proposed home. Women and girls are to be sent there as a corrective.

The bill appropriates \$450,000 for the state to take over the Columbia Southern Irrigation project and put it through to completion will probably become a law, as it passed the senate and is known to be approved by the governor, or at least has been consistently recommended by him.

**Progressive Party Recognized.**  
SALEM, Feb. 26.—The house passed a bill by Upton which will give the progressive party the right to enter the primaries in Portland this spring. It recognizes the party officially.

Among the bills passed by the House was one by Barton, relating to fishing for salmon in certain streams. The senate killed a bill by the committee on the revision of laws for the repealing of the right of the county courts to grant emergency franchises to corporations for the use of streams.

### ARE LAYING STEEL.

Work Started Near Eugene from Crossing Northward.

PORTLAND, Feb. 26.—Orders were issued for laying steel on 12 miles of Portland, Eugene & Eastern roadway north of Eugene. This will cover the distance to Long Tom river, eight miles from the crossing of the new road being built to Coos Bay. This order was one of the first issued by Robert E. Strahorn, president of the road, upon his return from San Francisco, where he passed three weeks.

It is expected that the rails will reach the Long Tom within 10 days.

J. W. Hall, assistant engineer, will be in charge of the construction. Flagg and Standifer, contractors, have completed the three long trestles which cross the Long Tom bottoms, with the exception of three gaps. These will be temporarily bridged by the contractors in order to allow them to take in the two powerful steam shovels, which are now en route to Eugene.

### USE MILKING MACHINES.

W. E. Catteran, the Star ranch man, will install three or four milking machines on his ranch. Mr. Catteran is the first man in this vicinity to do such and if successful there is no doubt but what the other dairymen will follow suit.

# "BOOZE" BILL GETS LARGER

### AMOUNT PAID OUT BY AMERICANS FOR LIQUORS AND TOBACCO IS CONSTANTLY INCREASING.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 26.—Americans are drinking more whisky, smoking more cigars and cigarettes and chewing more tobacco than ever before in history, according to latest statistic returns to Royal E. Cabell, commissioner of internal revenue.

From July to February the nation consumed 94,000,000 gallons of whisky, an increase of 5,000,000 gallons over the previous year; 8,500,000,000 cigarettes, an increase of 2,250,000,000; 4,500,000,000 cigars, an increase of 250,000,000; 250,000,000 pounds of smoking and chewing tobacco, an increase of 12,000,000 pounds. These are record figures.

In addition, drinkers of beer are resuming their stride. During the fiscal year 1912 the consumption of beer fell off materially, but the first seven months of this fiscal year the people of the United States have drunk 39,864,000 barrels, an increase of 1,850,000 barrels over last year.

Drinkers, smokers and chewers are thus enriching the federal government. Internal revenue taxes from July 1 to date, are \$12,500,000 greater than any previous record for a similar period.

### BANDON MAN'S PLANS.

J. R. Stillwell to Conduct Fight Against White Slavers.

PORTLAND, Ore., Feb. 27.—Grieved by the fate of a Bandon girl, who was lured from home by white slavers, J. R. Stillwell of Bandon has come to Portland to lead in the organization of a state wide educational campaign that will warn the rural residents against the wiles of the white slavers.

"Speakers will be routed through the rural districts of Oregon, giving the people information about the organized traffic in girls that robs 50,000 American homes annually and causes the unexplained disappearance of not less than 500 girls in Oregon every year.

"We have a preliminary list of philanthropic people who will aid in meeting the cost of the lecture tours. Insofar as possible, the speakers will contribute their time above the bare cost of traveling. We do not propose to quit with one tour, but to continue the work. Speakers will use both moving pictures and stereopticons to illustrate their addresses.

The crusade against the white slave traffic in Oregon will be conducted under the direction of the anti-vice committee of the Automobile league, which has offices in the Selling-Hirsch building.

Mr. Stillwell says he learned about the unhappy lot of Edith Willard, a girl of 17, who was attracted from Bandon by an apparently respectable woman, who promised her employment. The girl was later discovered in one of the worst of the San Francisco resorts.

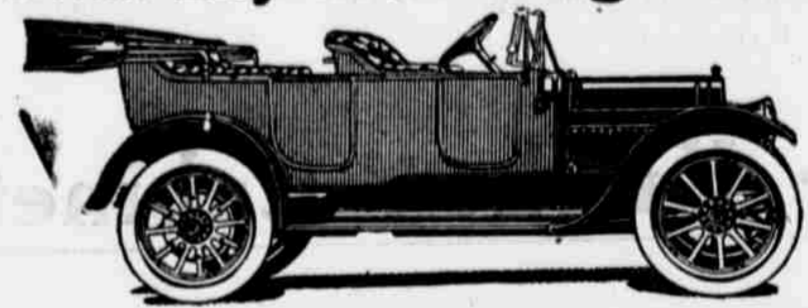
