**Meet Friday Night**—The Marshfield Chamber of Commerce will meet tomorrow night to discuss a Coos county exhibit at the San Francisco exposition and also new quarters for the Chamber of Commerce. It is likely that a second floor office suite will be secured. Other matters are also to come up.

**Naval Militia**—Captain Macgenn reports that the Oregon Naval Militia Board of Portland is planning to probe the Coos Bay division and unless the members here show some signs of interest and making the organization active, it will be mustered out. Captain Macgenn suggests that it would be better if the members here, if they do not want to maintain the division, would resign and ask to be mustered out.

**Pay Interest**—It is stated that one of the bills that passed the Oregon legislature requires banks to pay at least one per cent interest on the county funds deposited with them. The county commissioners are required to designate the county depositories and require them to furnish bond. At one per cent, it is estimated that Coos County would receive about \$2,000 interest per annum on its funds.

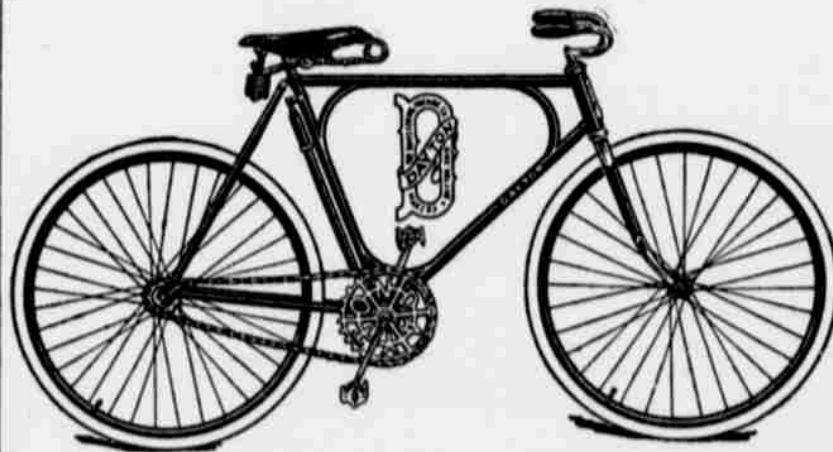
