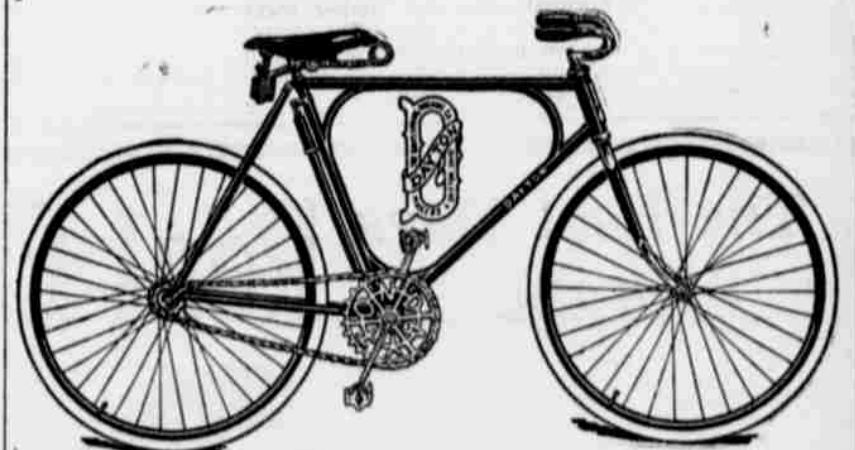
arranging to build a double house on North Second street, above Highland. The house will be located on the Second street frontage of the Nasburg property, which Mrs. Converse recently purchased.
