10,000 BOYS IN RELAY RACE

LOS ANGELES, March 11.—Ten thousand boy athletes scattered across the thirteen states lying between New York and San Francisco will run in half-mile relays from the Atlantic metropolis to San Francisco and Los Angeles and San Diego in 1915. If plans formulated by Harry D. Cross, secretary of the boys' department of the Young Men's Christian Association in Los Angeles are carried out.

Cross announced that if his plan were put into operation the boys would be the means of conveying a message from New York to the delegates of the International Convention of the Young Men's Christian Association to be held in Los Angeles in 1915, and also to the Panama-California Exposition in San Diego.

To make such a gigantic relay run feasible, Cross said it would be necessary to obtain the co-operation of all across the country. He declared he believed the event could be completed, even across the divide, and the deserts, in eight or nine days, excluding Sunday. Cross declared that besides being one of the greatest running events of history, such an athletic event would be one of the best possible means of advertising the two expositions to be held in California in 1915, and incidentally the International Convention of the Young Men's Christian Association.

CIVIL SERVICE EXAM.

Men Only Eligible for Positions Open in Marshfield Now.

The U. S. Civil Service Commission announces a male clerk-carrier examination to be held at Marshfield, Oregon, April 12, 1913, to establish an eligible register from which selection may be made to fill such vacancies as may occur from time to time in the Marshfield postoffice. Men only are eligible for this examination.

MORAL CRUSADE IN COQUILLE

Women There Launch Movement to Protect Young—Officials' Views.

The Coquille Sentinel says:
An appeal for the betterment of social conditions in Coquille, and one that promises to become productive of good, was that made by the Woman's Study Club to the council Monday evening.

Fourteen signatures of prominent townswomen appeared upon a petition, praying the councilmen to take cognizance of prevailing conditions among the younger people of this city, and to exert itself to raise the moral standard of the community. Mrs. McL. Robertson addressed the council briefly and presented the following petition for its consideration:

"It is with alarm that we learn that the young men and boys (minors) of this community are found upon our streets in an intoxicated condition, often late at night, and that girls of our town are allowed to roam the streets either alone—or worse than alone—in bad company of both sexes, when they should be under the protection of their parents.

"Owing to these conditions, it is requested that this council take particular notice of the sale of liquor to minors, see that the curfew law is vigorously enforced and instruct the night marshal to take charge of such cases as are found on the streets in direct opposition to these instructions and if necessary that he have several deputies (men or women).

"We also request that all other laws found upon the statute books of this city, for the protection of our young people, be enforced."

This appeal to the council is signed by Mrs. McL. Robertson, Mrs. Della L. Belloni, Mrs. Harriet A. Longston, Mrs. C. J. Fuhrman, Mrs. E. M. Lyons, Francis E. Epperson, Bertha J. Smith, Florence M. Rogers, Eva M. Barrow, Mrs. H. E. Hoag, Mrs. R. S. Knowlton, Mrs. W. Candlin, Mrs. C. L. Kidder and Mrs. N. N. Neilman.

Mayor Morrison frankly acknowledged that what had been said of the morality of the young people of Coquille was only too true. The authorities, he said, had repeatedly tried to get evidence against those who had sold liquor to minors, but their efforts had proved futile. The chief executive, he said, was glad to have the citizens co-operate with the peace officers in securing sufficient evidence against such violators of the law, and gave assurance that he would do all within his power to bring them to justice. He was satisfied that there are men in town who make it a business to furnish liquor to minors.

City Attorney Liljeqvist, who is also deputy prosecutor of the county, said he had been arrested at least 25 boys under 18 years of age within the past five years, and only one had been sent to the reform school as provided for in such cases by the statutes. He took Judge Hall of the juvenile court to task for his attitude in the matter, saying he is averse to taking this action.
