**LEAVE TODAY  
ON BREAKWATER**

The firemen all walked out and Supt. Miller had to get in connection with Portland about the matter. Finally Captain Macgenn explained that Nelson's conviction followed his own admission and not because the cook's department had more witnesses than the firemen's. The firemen thought that they had got the worst of the deal. Finally they raised money to pay Nelson's fine and he was released. Hard feeling between the cook's department and the firemen was the cause of the trouble. Had not Nelson's fine been paid he would have been sent to Coquille today to serve a sentence.

**PALM SUNDAY**
