Plans for making the Marshfield elty library a county library was considered at the last meeting of The ma:the Hbrary committee. ter was brought up by a letter from Miss Marvin, secretary of the Oregon Library Commission, who wants to extend the library work in this section. By minking it a county li-brary, the financial assistance of the county commissioners could be secured and the benefits of Hbrary works extended to rural communi-The Hurary committee will take the matter up with the Marsh field city council and also with the county commissioners April 9.

The committee also decided to confer with the Marshfield school board about the latter paying an assistant librarian and extending the benefits of the library further to the school children. There has been a big increase in the use of the library by the pupils.

A letter was drafted to be sent to the Carnegie foundation today asking for an \$18,000 donation for a library building in Marshfield.


