(From the Coos Bay News, publish-  
ed at Marshfield, March 17, 1880.  
—Sigin & Bennett publishers.)  
Mrs. Noah Tripp is lying very ill  
at Coaledo.  
The steamer Gussie Telfair arriv-  
ed on Monday.  
Work is rapidly progressing on  
the cribs, the fourth one being un-  
der way.  
Born—At Bandon, March 5, 1880,  
to the wife of John Erickson, a  
daughter.  
The lately wrecked Emma Uter  
is nearly ready to launch again, as  
good as new.  
Prof. McCormack will not teach af-  
ter the present term, so we are in-  
formed, but Mrs. Rotnor will con-  
tinue the school.  
The Arcata is to be laid up for  
repairs and changes. Fifty feet is  
to be added to her length, so we are  
informed.  
Capt. Dan Roberts has taken  
charge of the Centennial Hotel at  
Utter City, where the traveling pub-  
lic will find good accommodations.  
William Winsor of Port Orford  
called at our sanctum this week.  
Mr. Winsor was formerly a resident  
of Empire and is well known on the  
Bay. He has been keeping a hotel at  
Port Orford for a number of  
years.  
F. G. Lockhart is superintendent  
of the Eagle mine. This is the origi-  
nal Lockhart mine. The sand is  
being worked by a new process,  
with what success we cannot say,  
although we hear it is a decided  
improvement on the way heretofore  
practiced.
