HARD TRIP IS MADE BY BOAT

F. H. Schlegelmilch and Party of Seven Navigate Umpqua.

F. H. Schlegelmilch and wife, their son, Harold Schlegelmilch, and his sister, Mrs. Jessie Wittschen, and little son, Eugene, and Miss Della Kuney, arrived here this morning after having made the trip from Roseburg to Gardiner by boat.

The trip was made in a flat bottom scow 26 feet long and eight feet wide. It had no cabin but was rigged so that a tent could be pitched on it at night for sleeping quarters.

The actual running time was four days and a half, but they stopped at several places on account of the weather so that they were a little over a week en route.

The families were anxious to come to Coos Bay and figured that they could make the river trip much more cheaply than around by Portland.

Mr. Schlegelmilch said that Geo. Brown and other Roseburg people tried to stop them but he knew the trip could be made safely. They had trouble only once when they got the wrong way of the channel above Coles Valley, but they got off all right.

Mr. Schlegelmilch wanted to bring his scow to the bay but the Gleaner would not tow it on account of the bad weather. He may bring it later.

He is a mill man and may engage in business here for himself. They came from Carolina a few years ago.
