

**ALL OVER OREGON**

**PORTLAND**—The Meier & Frank store of this city has declared that on May 1 an eight-hour day for all employees a minimum wage of \$8 a week for all women employees and \$6 a week for apprentices and minors, will be put into effect.

**PORTLAND**—Claiming that the city has no authority under its present charter to levy an occupation tax on the gross earnings of companies furnishing gas and electricity, the Portland Gas & Coke Co., demurred to the suit of the city to collect \$34,362, claimed as due for 1912.

**SALEM**—On behalf of all the state institutions, Gov. West has filed a complaint with the state railroad commission alleging that the rate charged for electricity furnished by the P. R. L. & P. Co., to penitentiary, insane asylum etc., were unjust and unreasonable.

**PORTLAND**—Councilman-at-large Ralph C. Clyde, has filed a declaration of his intention to become a candidate for re-election.

**OREGON CITY**—Henry Meldrum, city engineer under the Carl administration, has filed a complaint in the circuit court charging that City Engineer C. S. Noble and his assistant Geo. C. Tale, entered into a conspiracy with Mayor Jones and the city council for the purpose of giving Yale a chance to hold a position unlawfully.

**PORTLAND**—Mrs. Minnie E. Nelson has been appointed by Mayor Rushlight to take the place made vacant by the resignation of his former secretary, Geo. K. McCord, who will from now on direct the mayor's campaign for re-election.

**PORTLAND**—Franklin T. Griffith, present general attorney for the company, will succeed B. S. Josselyn as president of the P. R. L. & P. Co., on July 1.

**ALBANY**—The old South Methodist church building was discovered on fire by Night Policeman Marshall, who came upon the scene just as two men were seen dashing around the corner. These men were undoubtedly the incendiaries as coal-oil was discovered on all the walks.

**ALBANY**—Resenting the fact he was arrested on the charge of drunkenness, Otto Lesch, a tailor of this city, is alleged to have deliberately set fire to the city jail.

**ALBANY**—Wanted on a charge of larceny in Benton county, young George Ballard was arrested here by Officer Marshall and conducted to the county jail.

**MEDFORD**—Upon complaint of former Police Chief Noe, of Gold Hill, a warrant has been issued by Justice of the Peace Taylor, for the arrest of Joe Beeman of Gold Hill who is accused of perjury.

**OREGON CITY**—While excavating in the basement of a house owned by Frank Busch, a grave was found, which is believed to be one of the oldest in the Northwest.

**PENDLETON**—Circuit Judge Phelps has handed down a decision in the case of James Johns vs. the City of Pendleton, for the defendant.

**PORTLAND**—The organization of the Oregon Association for the education of deaf children has been completed. The following officers were elected: Mrs. C. A. Ward, president; F. S. McFarland, vice president; Mrs. C. G. Leo, secretary and W. L. Mitchell, treasurer.

Messrs. T. G. Owen and J. W. Hamilton left for the valley to attend the Democratic state convention to which they are delegates. They are both Tillden men.

The Noble brothers sold the stock of their livery stable to George Dyer, who has also rented the stable for one year. The Messrs. Noble are in the logging business on Pony Slough, and if energy and industry insure success, they'll make it win.

Stock suffered greatly during the last two weeks. Stockmen should keep sufficient hay on hand to feed all their stock for a month or two during the winter. Most of our winters are so mild as not to render the precaution necessary, but the past winter is proof that the necessity may occur.
