Opening Coast Counties

LITTLE by little the reproach of Oregon, that of possessing vast but undeveloped resources, is being removed, says the Portland Journal.

The rugged nature of the coast counties, lying between the western edge of the Willamette valley and the Pacific, deterred the railroad builder for many years. It was in vain that the true story was told of a wide region abounding in valleys of great fertility, a future dairy and stock country, where also sheep and goats flourish, a country where families can live in comfort on a few acres, a country of reasonably priced lands and incoming settlement. Railroad builders shook their heads.

In the end it has come, or is coming, about that competition would secure what independent invitations failed to gain.

A glance at a map where lines in building or in prospect are laid down shows various roads projected westward from the valley to the ocean.
