**Opening Coast Counties** 

being removed, says the Portland Journal

The rugged nature of the coast counties, lying between the western edge of the Willamette valley and the Pacific, deterred the railroad builder for many years. It was in vain that the true story was told of a wide region abounding in valleys of great fertility, a future dairy and stock country, where also sheep and goats flourish, a country where families can live in comfort on a few acres, a country of reasonably priced lands and incoming settlement. Rallroad builders shook their heads.

In the end it has come, or is com ing, about that competition would secure what independent invitations railed to gain.

A glance at a map where lines in building or in prospect are laid down shows various roads projected westward from the valley to the ocean. West of the Coast Range is no longer a terra incognita to either the railcoad or the highroad builder. Last summer and early fall many an auomobile party pushed its way brough, and found practicable roads and a country abounding in scenic senuties.

Between Tillamook and Yaquina s a long and splendid coast line, of great black cliffs, and green tringed coves, fir clad and fern clad o the very brink.
