SALEM—Owners of warehouses erected on property owned by the Southern Pacific Railroad Company are making complaints to the railroad commission against the company's demand for an increased rental for the ground use, from \$5 to \$25 a year.

ST. HELENS—The city election resulted in the selection of A. W. Mueller, mayor; J. E. Ramsey and Magnus Saxon, councilmen; H. J. Southard, water commissioner; and Iva E. Dodd, treasurer.

HOOD RIVER—L. Tauscher, who was tried for the illicit sale of liquor in Hood River county, has been convicted and fined \$100.

PORTLAND—A "municipal reference" library has been instituted in Portland, under the management of the public library, for the aid of any citizen wishing to know the latest facts about municipal affairs.

BROWNSVILLE—Mrs. Gertrude Miller, of this city, has been elected City Treasurer at the annual city election.

ALBANY—William Hanna died at Mill City of smallpox after an illness of a week or two.
