Sec. Lane Will Try to Cultivate and Develop of It

C., April 19.—Secretary Lane has under consideration the proposal that lands in the west be turned over to the department of agriculture for settlement and development as the engineering works are finished by the reclamation service engineers and the secretary to present the matter to the department of the interior. The secretary was told that the settlement of reclaimed lands has largely increased and that the department should extend its supervision to compel the settlement in the spirit of the law.

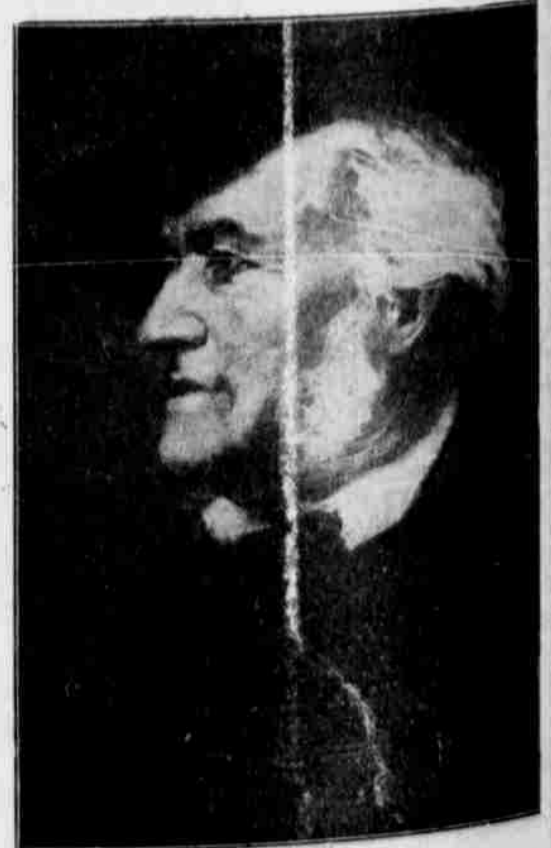
