### ORANGE TREES IN DEMAND.

20,000 Per Day Shipped into the Frost Belt of California.

PORTERVILLE, Cal., May 6.—Never in the history of this section has the demand for orange trees been as great as during the last two weeks. The shipments to California and Arizona points have been as high as 20,000 per day. The trees will take the place of those damaged by frost last winter.

### LIBRARY NOTES.

Among the new books received are three of essays, "Humanly Speaking," by Corrothers; "Some English Story Tellers," and "Some American Story Tellers," by Cooper.

"Humanly Speaking" is a whimsical, charming book on the traditions and inconsistencies of human nature in general. Some of the titles of the essays are "In the Hands of a Receiver," "The American Temperament," "The Obviousness of Dilemmas," and "On Realism as an Investment."

The following extract from "In the Hands of a Receiver," illustrates the style:

"Oh, the citizen's obligation. The obligation of every American citizen to see that every other American does his duty and to be quick about it.

"The janitor's duties, the board of health's duties, the milkman's duties, resting upon each one of us individually with the accumulated weight of every cubic foot of vitiated air, and multiplied by the number of bacteria in every cubic centimeter of milk.

The duty of knowing what you are talking about, and of talking about all the things you ought to know about."

Dealing with modern fiction instead of modern idiosyncrasy of human nature "Some English Story Tellers" and "Some American Story Tellers" are books on subjects very difficult upon which to find a book.
