Prohibition's Onward March.
Ohio: Eighty-five per cent of the state is dry territory. Out of the eighty-eight counties forty-five are dry and in the forty-three wet counties, by the local option law, seven-eighths of the territory is dry.

Texas: Of 249 counties 175 are under prohibition, twenty are wet and fifty-four partially wet. In many of the latter, however, liquor is sold only in the county seat.

Oregon: Of thirty-three counties, eight are dry, and there is an increasing number of dry towns.

New York: Of the 923 townships, nearly one-half are under no license, and 200 under partial license.

South Carolina: Of forty-three counties thirty-six are under prohibition, while the remainder have dispensaries only in the principal cities, inmost counties, only the county seat.

Missouri: Out of 114 counties eighty-seven are wholly or partially dry under local option and the prospect is good for many more this year.

Nebraska: Out of ninety counties, thirty-one are dry. At the present time about one-half of the population of the state is in dry territory.

Alaska has passed a law enfranchising its women the measure embodying a provision which exempts them from jury service.

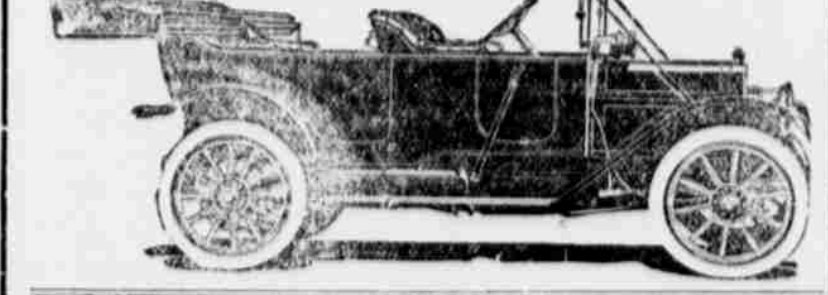
