# PULMOTOR AT HOSPITAL NOW

Device for Restoring Respiration Will be Kept There—Woman Died Suddenly.

The Oregon Power Company's pulmotor will henceforth be kept at Mercy hospital for emergency cases instead of at the company's plant. This is the result of the death of Mrs. J. E. Bressie, of North Bend, who died at the hospital the day before yesterday. It is believed that if the pulmotor had been immediately available that there would have been a strong chance of saving her life.

Mrs. Bressie died on the operating table. She had been taken to the hospital with a severe attack of appendicitis, necessitating an immediate operation to save her life. However, her lungs proved weak and respiration stopped soon after the anaesthetic was given, although her heart action is said to have continued for a few minutes after she stopped breathing.

The pulmotor was sent for, but in the twenty minutes or half hour necessary to secure it, death ensued.

The funeral of Mrs. Bressie was held this morning from the Marshfield M. E. Church, the Rev. Mr. Cooley officiating.
