ACROSS ROCKIES BY AUTOMOBILE

Dr. J. C. Sexton Arrives From
 Rushville, Ind., to Visit His
 Daughter, Mrs. Green.

Dr. J. C. Sexton, of Rushville, Ind., arrived here today via Myrtle Point, for a short visit at the home of his daughter, Mrs. D. C. Green. Dr. Sexton has just completed the Midland Tour across the Rockies by auto. He and about twenty other Indiana citizens, with about twenty different makes of autos manufactured in Indiana, made the long run from Indianapolis, stopping at the principal points and advocating better highways. The trip was a strenuous one, but was one of a lifetime and Dr. Sexton is glad he made it.

Dr. Sexton will spend some time in Coos County to see the great resources and beauty spots which Mr. and Mrs. Green have been graphically describing to him.

Seventy five composed the party that left Indianapolis in eighteen cars and two auto trucks. They were twenty-eight days on the trip, the actual running time being about twenty-six days. One of the features of the trip was the demonstration of a new carburetor which enables the substitution of coal oil for gasoline. The device worked perfectly and in addition to reducing the cost of fuel oil about half practically eliminates the cost of cylinder oil.

"With the exception of one or two points, I did not encounter as scenic and as beautiful a stretch of road as I did between Roseburg and Coos Bay," remarked Dr. Sexton today. "The country is beautiful and the road is not bad, that is it has the possibilities of being made a fine auto highway at a reasonable expense. In many places, it could be improved a hundred per cent for summer auto travel by digging a drain alongside of the road and throwing dirt into the chuck holes. "In our country, we have to depend on macadam and gravel for improving highways, but we are doing it. Roads are made for auto travel twelve months in the year. It seemed to me that there was plenty of good road making material available between here and Roseburg to build a good highway. "The automobiles are doing wonders for road development. At every city, every town and every hamlet that we visited on the long tour, we found a great enthusiasm for good

PLEDGE AID TO COOS COUNTY

Roseburg Good Roads Boosters Send Resolutions to Local Association.

ROSEBURG, Or., Aug. 1.—Henry Harth and Carl D. Shoemaker, president and secretary respectively of the Douglas County Good Roads Association, forwarded to the Coos County Good Roads Association a resolution adopted at the good roads meeting held here last Friday night. At that meeting a committee composed of George Nountr, George M. Brown and Dr. E. B. Stewart was appointed to draft a suitable resolution encouraging and endorsing

the action of the Coos County association in their efforts to get a hard surface road through the Coquille Canon.

This resolution was drafted today and handed to the officers of the local good roads association. It reads as follows:

"Roseburg, Or., July 25, 1913.

"Whereas, The Good Roads Association of Coos County, Oregon, has recently gone upon record as favoring the bonding of said county for the full amount of its legal indebtedness, for the purpose of improving its highways and especially designating the construction of a hard surface road between the Douglas County line and Sunset Bay on Coos Bay, Oregon, via Bridge, and

"Whereas, Said Coos County Good Roads Association has been and is the pioneer in favoring and advocating the construction and improvement of such a highway, which would greatly aid the development of Western Douglas and Coos Counties and bring about a greater commercial intercourse between these two banner counties of this great commonwealth generally, now therefore,

"Be it Resolved by the Good Roads Association of Douglas County, at a meeting held in Roseburg, on the 25th day of July, 1913, that we heartily appreciate and endorse the activity of the Coos County Good Roads Association in this great movement, and do hereby pledge said association our loyal support and hearty co-operation in an endeavor of bringing about the construction and improvement of a permanent highway from the Coos County line to Roseburg via Camas Valley and Brockway, and thus by an united effort bringing us in closer touch with our sister county, and its great natural resources.
