serious delays are encountered, the Oregon Eastern line of the O-W. R. & N. company will be completed to Riverside within ninety days. The road is being built from Vale and the distance to Riverside, through the Malheur Canyon and Valley, is about eighty miles. Trains will be in operation between the two points by November if work progresses in accordance with plans.

The line will tap a large body of land that is to be thrown open to settlement this month, land that some years ago was reserved by the Government. Some of this land is mountainous and rough, but there are also stretches of considerable area that are splendidly adapted for dry farming.

Population of Marshfield, 625.

Oregon almost doubled its population during the last decade.

Henry Rhodes, town marshal, has resigned. Reason: nothing in it.

Messrs. Hirst, Anderson and Dr. Golden are off on a trip to the upper falls on Coos River.

Coos and Curry Counties have less than four persons to each voter. Too many old bachelors.

W. H. Noble killed three deer near Marshfield last Sunday. He was out only about an hour.

Mr. Crosby, lighthouse keeper at Cape Arago, has resigned. Pay too small. Plenty will be glad of the situation.

Married, at the residence of the bride's parents, on Coos River, July 29, 1880, by S. Rogers, J. P., Mr. J. A. Lennan and Miss Cora I. Given.

Each school district will draw from the state school fund, in September, 77 cents for each person reported within the school age. This district will draw \$154.

Coos County is paying interest on \$11,050.63. Its indebtedness is that sum including whatever interest may now be due on it. Last year the county paid \$1458.22 in interest on its indebtedness.

Coos and Curry Counties have over 6000 population. Douglas has a little over 9000. Douglas has just double the representation in the Legislature of Coos and Curry. Shouldn't there be a new deal?
