NO VOTERS TO VOTE ON PORT

Bandon Port Election Tomorrow Causes Peculiar Condition in Some Precincts.

The Bandon port election will be held tomorrow. C. A. Sehlbrele left today for South Slough where he is one of the judges of the election. The South Slough precinct reaches over into the Coquille watershed, but there is not a single voter living in that part, so that although the formality of holding election has to be gone through with, there will not be a single vote cast.

It is said that a similar condition exists in part of the Coos River and Sumner precincts which lap over into the proposed Port district.

The Bandon people have been working hard for the port and expect that it will carry although it is said that Coquille and vicinity will vote against it.

CONTRACT LET TO PEART BROS.

Awarded Job of Grading Tenth Street Extension to First Addition Now.

Peart Brothers, contractors, have just been awarded the job of grading South Tenth street for the Reynolds Development Company. The portion of Tenth street to be graded lies just south of the city limits in First Addition to Marshfield.

In order to get the best possible grade, a cut had to be made for the entire distance covered by the contract varying in depth from one to eight feet. The surplus dirt will be distributed over nearby lots for the purpose of leveling and improving them.

Peart Brothers will commence the work immediately so as to finish the job within thirty days.

The part of Tenth street to be thus improved joins at forms an extension to the grading job just completed by Barclay & Moon.

The Reynolds Development Company plans to grade and plank two feet of streets in First Addition this summer. All this work will be rushed so that the streets will be ready for the laying of water mains before this season.

BRUSCHKE ON STEEL PLANT

Editor of Coos Bay Times: The Times of 25th inst. on page 5, contains statements from Mr. Kreis which are anything but the real facts in the case of the Coos Bay Townsite property which he has secured through me, the agent for the Coos Bay Townsite Company, and believing it my duty that the good people are entitled to know the facts in the case, I kindly ask you to make the following statement known to the many readers of the Coos Bay Times:

In justice to Mr. Kreis, the good people of Marshfield, North Bend and myself, and all who read your paper and who are directly or indirectly interested in the well-fare of Coos Bay and the good state of Oregon, I would say that not on account of the office of the Coos Bay Realty Syndicate not being acceptable to Mr. Kreis, has this controversy arisen over the manipulation of the property of the Coos Bay Townsite Company. Let me explain: First Mr. Kreis and his associates through correspondence, were to erect iron and steel plants to employ 3500 employees. The Imperial Steel Company was the high sounding title of the concern. Then the Imperial Steel Company also came into view and far out on the horizon were box, canning, preserving and furniture factories, hotels, etc. It seems strange that the last has come first in the talk about the building of this city of Coos Bay and the steel plant propositions have gone into oblivion. The same as the one projected at Prince Albert, Saskatchewan, the photo-electrotype of which many of you have seen.

I was the means of having Mr. Kreis here, all done in good faith, that he must assure me by giving a bond that he would perform certain things, which in their doing or failure meant much either for good or bad to the name of Coos Bay. You can readily see that with this bond behind me, the trouble for the City of Coos Bay townsite would have been over, for with the starting of the great steel plants (which he now acknowledges impossible) the rest would have been easy.

He told me that he could not give the bond and then I felt my ground was getting to be very slippery and I might fall down, and not having any foundation to light on (without this bond). Then followed other matters that did not seem good to me, and in trying to get it in shape so that it could be sanely and sagely carried on, is where Mr. Kreis seemed to hold back. Mr. Kreis, I understand, has an option on the property to sell it out in lots under certain conditions; these conditions are what I wanted a bond for, that they would be fulfilled.

The good people of Marshfield and Coos County have not all forgotten the Knuppenburg deal of a few years ago, and I wanted the bond to prevent a repetition before I would offer to sell any of the lots as I did in the Knuppenburg case, and those who took my advice know now that they had acted wisely, and I am sure will not blame me now for working for the interests and good name of Coos Bay.
