### Footnote is Fined.

City Recorder Butler yesterday imposed a fine of \$25 on D. L. Foote for violating the speed ordinance. Foote was charged with speeding on July 5, but claimed that he was not driving the car at the time specified. Many witnesses testified on both sides and after considering it, Recorder Butler found Foote guilty. The fine will probably be paid at once.
