### WILL START A MUSICAL BUREAU

Rev. J. Richard Olson Will Try New Plan in Portland.

The following from a Portland paper will be of interest here as Rev. J. Richard Olson was pastor of the Marshfield and North Bend Swedish Lutheran Churches until about eighteen months ago:

"Popular concerts will be a new feature tried out here this week by the recently organized Musical Bureau, of which Rev. J. Richard Olson is President and Mrs. C. O. Young, Secretary. The purpose, the President states, is to provide means to give the public an opportunity to hear the best music at a nominal cost.

"The concerts will be given on the ground floor of the Goodnough building, Fifth and Yamhill streets, and if the project meets with public approval, new artists will be presented each week, although the program will vary with each day.

"This is a step towards popularizing art," said President Olson, in explaining the purpose, "for it will give the masses opportunity at a nominal cost to enjoy and become familiar with the best in the various lines of art, an opportunity heretofore not presented in this country."

**JIM HILL IS 75.**  
Veteran Railway Magnate Celebrated Birthday at Glacier Park.

GLACIER PARK, Mont., Sept. 18. James J. Hill, founder of the Great Northern Railway, was 75 years old and celebrated his birthday here.

More than 300 members of the Veterans' Association of the Great Northern reached Glacier Park in a special train of thirteen cars this morning. W. P. Kenney, vice-president, conducted the party to the park. The members of the association, headed by William J. McMillan, first vice-president, presented the empire roses. The first annual session of the organization was held today. Many veterans have been with the road since the days of its infancy, when it was called the St. Paul & Pacific. Twenty-five years of service are required for membership.

In the party of the veterans here today are three brothers, J. J., Frank and William T. Maher, whose combined service with the Great Northern totals 94 years.

Graves, to show cause why you should not be disbarred from the practice of law by reason of the alleged commission of those acts which are of more than personal magnitude, and which tend to the discredit of the Coos County Bar Association,

Now therefore, be it resolved that the Coos County Bar Association does hereby express its confidence in you, Robert O. Graves, and commend you as an attorney at law worthy of the confidence of this Association and of the public, and,

Does hereby tender, as an expression of such confidence, all the assistance which the circumstances warrant by way of counsel and legal assistance from any and all members of this Association so far as desired by you.

Hereby assuring you of united and hearty support.

Be it further resolved, that a copy of this resolution be spread upon the minutes of this Association, and that the original hereof be delivered to Robert O. Graves.
