BOOSTS FOR MARSHFIELD

D. C. Green Says It Is the Biggest Little Town in the United States.

A Portland paper says: "Marshfield is the biggest little town in the United States," said D. C. Green, a prominent business man of Marshfield, at the Portland hotel.

"As proof of his assertion Mr. Green declared that the Simpson Lumber company's mill at North Bend, which has been shut down for improvements, will resume work next week with an increased capacity of 25 per cent. The C. A. Smith East Side Mill at Marshfield, which has been remodelled during the past two months, will also resume work next week. The new pulp mill of the company, built at a cost of \$500,000, will begin operations October 1. This pulp mill, by the way, is the only one of its kind in the United States. It manufactures pulp out of fir wood and in the process uses salt water. Turpentine, resin and alcohol are some of its by-products. The mill was constructed under the direction of two experts from Sweden. In its operation a force of 200 men will be employed. At North Bend there is quite a building boom and a \$50,000 hotel is under construction. The new railroad to Eugene will be completed within 18 months. In anticipation of the completion of the railroad there is great activity in the coal fields. The C. A. Smith company has opened a vein of coal with an output of fifty tons a day. The Southern Pacific is also doing a great deal of development work.

"We are going to improve our harbor too and by next year hope to have a federal appropriation for that purpose. Quote me as saying that Marshfield is the biggest little town in the United States."

DID YOU EAT YOUR 162 POUNDS OF MEAT

WASHINGTON, Sept. 30.—Americans are the biggest meat eaters in the world. They beat Johnny Bull with all his legends about the beef of old England. Moreover they eat more beef per capita than the British do.

Figures for meat eating in 1909, just made public by the bureau of animal industry of the department of agriculture show that the per capita consumption of meat for that year in the United States was 162.20 pounds, divided as follows: (fractions omitted) beef 80 pounds; Veal 7; pork, 67; mutton and lamb, 6; goat meat, 13.

Over in England where they boast about good old roast beef the per capita of that product is only 56 pounds. Moreover the proportion of beef in the total eaten by the American is exactly the same as the Britisher—47 per cent. Inhabitants of the "tight little isle" make up their total of eating 26 pounds of mutton a year as against the American's 6 pounds.

The Spanish are the smallest meat eaters, their per capita consumption being only 49 pounds. Germany's is 113 pounds. In both Germany and France pork is the favorite meat.

TELLS HOW TO WIN HUSBAND

DR. C. FRANKLIN LEAVITT, OF CHICAGO, EXPLAINS HOW WOMAN CAN MAKE HERSELF MORE ATTRACTIVE.

CHICAGO, Sept. 29.—Dr. C. Franklin Leavitt has made public a lesson in winning a husband by suggestion.

"We must visualize our desires before we can expect to realize them," he said. "A girl should picture the sort of woman she wishes to become, and then impress this picture on her subconscious mind so that it is ever with her.

"A woman may turn herself into a hag by depressing thoughts. A wise woman creates within herself conditions which attract. The subconscious mind is under direct control of the conscious mind and can be impressed through repeated strong suggestions.

"When a girl who is not attracting men comes to me, I ask her to look herself over for her weaknesses. If her cheeks are hollow I insist on her exercising the muscles of the face.

"An eye exercise gives her control of the muscles of the eyes. Before the mirror she learns the expression most becoming her eyes. 'The girl should give a handshake as if she had met a friend, and not in limp fashion. Thus she will emanate suggestions of love and harmony and not of condemnation and apprehension.

"A woman has two weapons, thought and action. When she is possessed of a 'going mind' she is almost irresistible. A woman with power wins the man she wants.

"The first lesson to all unattractive women should be to picture themselves in a receptive attitude toward men. From childhood they should be taught to meet the opposite sex without fear or bashfulness. Fear gives a shock.

"Thoughts properly directed can change the physical being. From concentration on a subject 15 minutes a day women have become beautiful. They should suggest to themselves at intervals that they are beautiful.

"Married women should take 'treatments' to retain the affections of their husbands. Going back to the old days of honeymoon attraction, she is able to keep her husband's interest."
