GETS NEXT TO PEOPLE.

Will Answer Some of the Chief Objections and Excuses of Men Sunday Evening.

Evangelist Samuel Gregg, who is now pastor of the Christian church of Marshfield, has been addressing some attention to the "religious won'ts and don'ts" of the men and women of Marshfield the last few days, and has succeeded in getting a lot of fresh material for a live, practical sermon in which all will be interested. The questions he has asked are: "Why do working men not attend church more?" and "What are some of your objections to churches?"

The following are some of the answers:

1st. "The church is too tame and does not meet our wants."

2nd. "The church people are not sincere; they don't practice what they preach."

3rd. "My business will not admit of my being a Christian."

4th. "The Bible is a lot of foolishness; I can't understand it."

5th. "I guess I am a hopeless case and nobody cares whether I am a Christian or whether I go to hell."

Several other questions were answered, but this list will show the character of those answered. Mr. Gregg will answer these objections separately next Sunday night and will treat everybody kindly in the matter. He uses no abuse, but deals considerably with all, and will give a sound scriptural and personal reason why the above objections are not well founded, and if so in any instance find out how such condition can be removed.
