TWO MEN KILLED BY FALL OF ROCK

Six Men Injured in Tunnel on Milwaukee Railroad in Washington.

SEATTLE, Wash., Oct. 23.—Six men who were injured when two were killed yesterday by a fall of rock in the Milwaukee railroad's tunnel, being driven through the Cascades, are in the hospital here and will recover. The two dead are Morris Hale, a machine driller's helper, and Matt Astlund, a mucker, both of Seattle. The accident occurred in the face of the tunnel, 1000 feet from the east portal. This is the first serious accident to occur in the tunnel.

DEDICATE PRINCETON COLLEGE BUILDINGS

Many Learned Men of Europe and America Assist in Exercises.

PRINCETON, Oct. 23.—Princeton University's Graduate College and the Grover Cleveland Memorial Tower, which is included in the architectural scheme of the college buildings, were dedicated yesterday in the presence of distinguished and learned men of Europe and America. Gifts of \$2,850,000 for the erection and endowment of these buildings enabled Princeton to realize the project conceived twenty years ago of housing the graduate students in a body.

EXEMPTS OFFICERS FROM CIVIL SERVICE LAW

President Says He Is Convinced They Were Not to Be Included.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Oct. 23.—The President signed the urgent deficiency bill carrying exemptions from the civil service of Deputy United States Marshals and Deputy Collectors of Internal Revenue. He gave out the following memorandum: "I am convinced after an examination of the facts that the offices of deputy marshals were never intended to be included under the ordinary provisions of the civil service law."

Capers of Clumbia, Tenn., had been chosen for the office, but an examination of the original draft of the resolution made today showed that the new Bishop of Spokane is Rev. Dr. W. T. Capers, Rector of the Church of the Holy Apostles in Philadelphia, and a brother of W. B. Capers.
