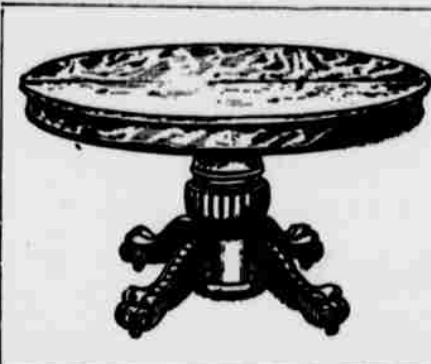

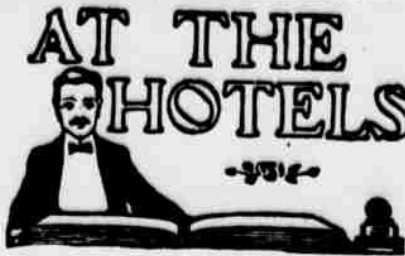

Good Apples and Good Roads

A COMBINATION THAT WOULD MAKE COOS COUNTY A PROSPEROUS PARADISE FOR EVERYONE.

(Written for The Times.)

MYRTLE POINT, Or., Nov. 6.—The Coquille Valley is without doubt one of the most favored spots on earth for the production of apples and pears, as well as nearly all kinds of berries. There are thousands of acres of hill land in this region that will produce Gravenstein apples and Bartlett pears, and also different varieties of winter pears in such profusion that a family can live on four or five acres. And it takes only a little money to get the land. Of course it will take elbow grease and patience to subdue the wild growth and get the trees to bearing, but isn't it better for the poor man with a family to do that than to work for wages year in and year out and just come out even at the end of each year?

To be sure, the apples raised here are not so dry and have not so leathery a skin as those grown in a dryer climate, but for eating qualities they can't be beaten and with careful handling and packing they can be shipped and arrive in market in good condition. The railroad will be here by the time the young orchards recently set out get to bearing and how can you get better returns from an acre of hill land than to get four or five boxes of Gravensteins to the tree from sixty trees?

Let the dairyman grow cow feed on his bottomland. He should encourage and help the apple grower by complying with the laws regarding the spraying and cleaning up of his orchard if he considers it worth the ground it grows on and if not, dig it up and not make it a breeding place for insects and disease. This region has been singularly free from the worst insect pests, but the codling moth is working down the river and if not checked will work serious injury. The inspection laws should be rigidly complied with and if all the orchardists will work hand in hand with the inspector and he will do his duty, we can soon be sending out train loads of apples that will sell at good prices. There will certainly be a big immigration to this coast in the near future, and if we can show the newcomers that they can make a good living on a few acres of hill land with a small outlay of cash, we can get the hill lands settled and relieve the owners of bottom land of a part of the bur-

den of taxation. If we could get one-half the good fruit land in Coos County set to trees and properly cared for we needn't fear to bond for twice \$450,000 for good roads. The apples will pay a good share of the debt and our children will thank us for incurring that debt and leaving it for them to pay. It is surely a great misfortune that we cannot vote the road bonds at this time, but let us plant apple trees and get all the ladies registered and be ready to fill the orders for apples and vote the road bonds when the time comes.

The secretary of the Coquille Valley Fruitgrowers Association is receiving many inquiries about apples and the fruit dealers of the large Eastern cities are ready to send their buyers here whenever we have the apples and the railroad to ship them direct.

LANE BOOSTS MULE CREEK.

Historic Section of Rogue Valley Wants Government Highway.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Nov. 6.—Senator Lane has taken up the cause of settlers in the Mule Creek region, in the Rogue River country, particularly in Josephine and Curry counties. They desire to have a road constructed across the mountains, but owing to the large areas there embraced in the forest reserve and in railroad grants, there is an insufficient income from taxes to meet the cost. Senator Lane says that he knows the region well, that it is one of the most delightful to be found anywhere, and was famous in the days of the early gold seekers as the location of Happy Camp. "The action of the Government in granting away millions of dollars worth of land and in conserving much more for the forests," said he, "has deprived the people of much of the taxable value that they should be able to draw on and I shall try to get Secretary of the Interior Lane to make a reasonable allowance for roads. Falling in that I shall ask Congress to make an appropriation, as it is in common justice bound to do. If it refuses, I shall feel very much hurt."

CULINGS OF COQUILLE

Coos County Seat News As Told by The Herald.
