Bryan had a long conference with President Wilson. Talk of the embargo on arms was dropped in Congressional circles. Senators have told President Wilson that there is an overwhelming sentiment in favor of permitting the export of arms to Mexico. The president in an address to Congress August, took a position against the embargo. Many have pointed out to him, however, that the alternatives open, if he declined to resign, was to demand support to the Constitutional movement. The battle in Louisiana, New Hampshire, and the second division of the Atlantic fleet, which were to be sent from duty in Mexican waters on the arrival of four vessels of the third division, were ordered to remain at Vera Cruz. The president also issued to the armorer California to remain in the waters, although original orders to the Pittsburg were to relieve California.
