[By Associated Press to Cook Bay Times.] PARIS, Dec. 4 .- The lowest quotations ever recorded for French 3 per cent Rentes was reached on the Paris Bourse yesterday when the price fell to eighty-four francs, seventy-five centimes. The sudden decline was a consequence of the fall of the cabinet under the premiership of J. Louis Barthou, which was defeated in the Champer of Deputies last night when it insisted upon the immunity of government bonds from taxation. Other securities were also affected by the ministerial crisis.

Among those mentioned as likely to head the new cabinet are Senator Jean Dupuy, former premier, and Senator Paul Louis Peytral, formerly Minister of Finance.
