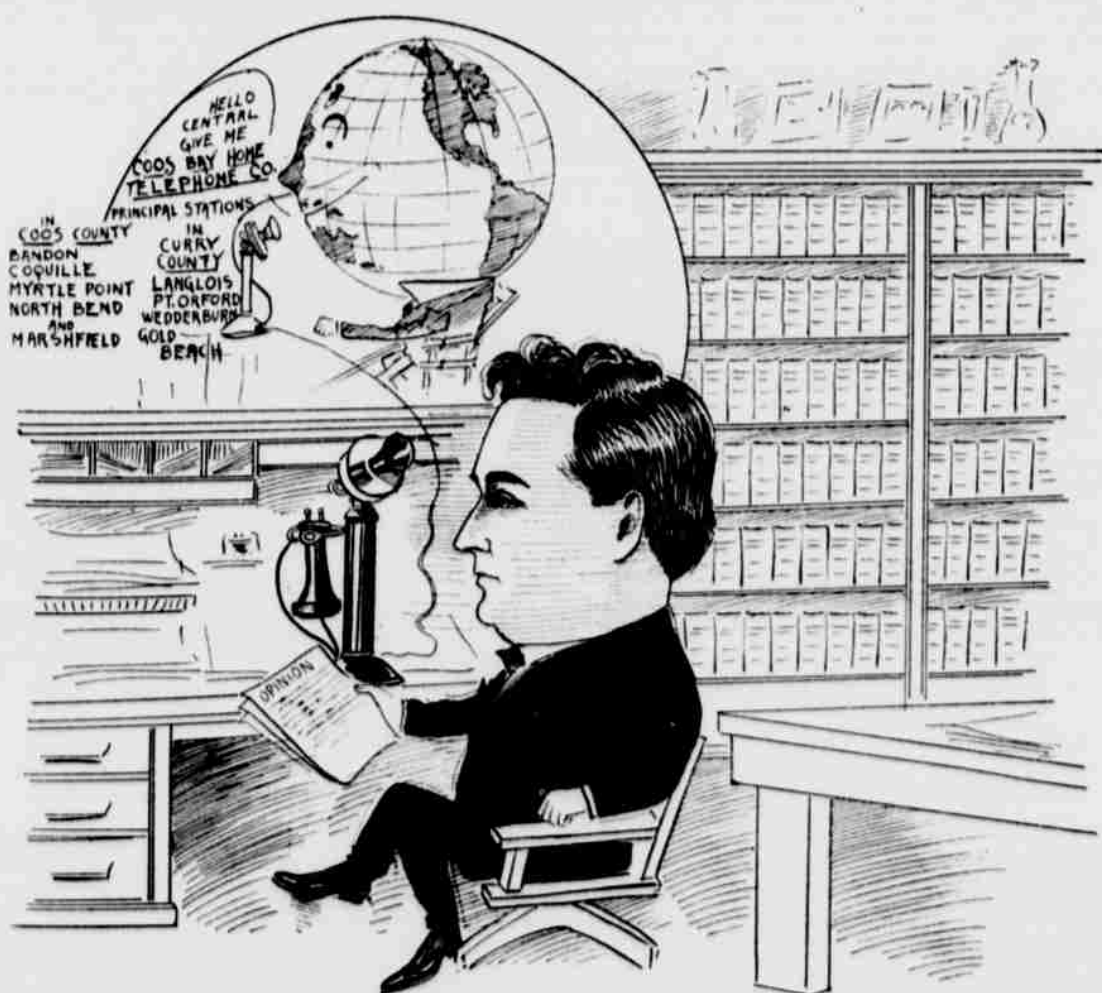
matters and is a liberal contributor to public affairs. In addition to his presidency of the institution which bears his name, Mr. Bennett has a large legal practice and stands high in his profession.
