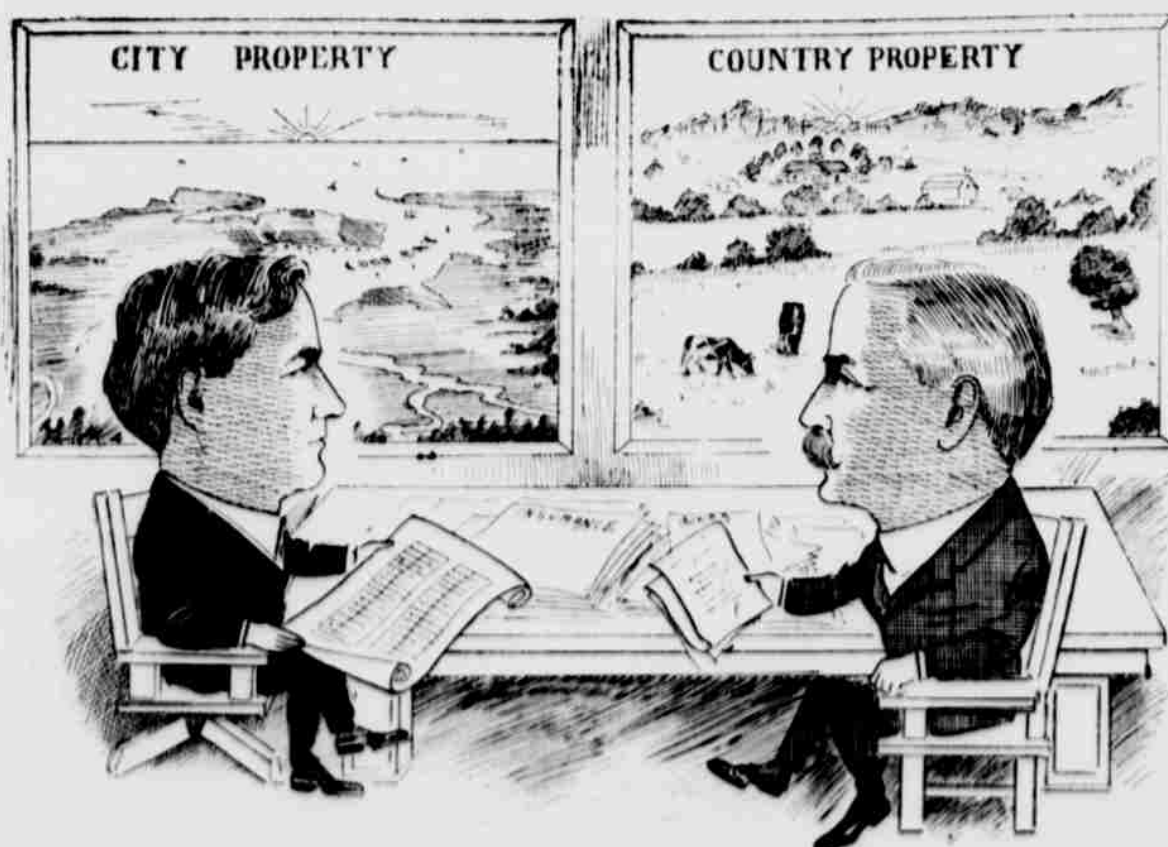
D. F. BARNARD
