Taxes legally levied and charged in any year shall be paid before the ures as above. first day of April following. If the April, penalties shall be charged on ceedings by telephone. such taxes and added to and collected with the same as follows;

1-A penalty of one per cent on 1—A penalty of one per cent on all taxes paid on or after said 1st day of April and before the 1st day of May following.

2-A penalty of two per cent on all taxes paid on or after the 1st day of May and before the first day of June following.

3-A penalty of three per cent on of June and before the first day of Examination as to Sanity of a petition which few take the time July following.

4-A penalty of four per cent on all taxes paid on or after the 1st day of July and before the 1st day of August following.

Provided, that one-half of the taxes against any particular parcel of real property, or of the taxes on personal property charged against individual, firm, etc., may paid before the said first day of April, in which event the penalties specified in this section shall apply to and be collected with the remaining one-half of such taxes, to be paid prior to the 1st day of September following. All taxes remaining unpaid on the first day of September shall become delinquent. Upon all taxes so delinquent there shall be charged and collected a penalty of of 12 per cent per annum on such taxes from the day on which they became delinquent until their pay-
