Speculators Cause Slash in Values When Leading Long Hedges Holdings

[By Associated Press to Coos Bay Times.]
CHICAGO, Jan. 5.—Corn prices crashed downward Saturday, January delivery breaking nearly three cents a bushel. The same corn that four days ago brought seventy-two cents, sold this morning for sixty-one and a half cents, a fall of nearly ten cents. SOME PIONEER NEWS.

Mrs. Behrie won the quilt raffled last Thursday night. Mrs. Lowe realized \$37.50 on the quilt and everyone is glad of it. Mrs. Lowe is one of the oldest settlers in the county, if not the oldest lady.

Dr. Golden, on his way east, was ten days going through Nevada and Wyoming on account of the deep snow. The doctor will find even Louisiana colder than Coos Bay, on his arrival there. Coos county can't be beaten for climate, and a trip east in the winter is almost necessary to make a person appreciate it.

Clara Bailey, only daughter of S. S. Bailey, is dangerously ill.

The people at Southport had a Christmas tree, and Willie Jones delivered an address at the opening of the exercises, which we hear highly complimented. We noticed in a college paper lately where Mr. Jones was an attorney for the defense in a murder trial in a moot court. Whether or not his client was hanged we did not learn, but we think Willie could at least convince a California jury that the killing was done in a fit of emotional insanity, if he could not satisfy the jury that his client was really the injured party and that the dead man was the fellow that should be strung up.

An unsuccessful attempt to shoot Nat L. Baker was made on last Sunday night by some fellow evidently not aware that the game law was in force. But seriously, boys, unless these bickerings can be compromised we are going to get an old boiler and sleep in it. C. Myer was held to answer on a charge of perjury by Judge Tower last Thursday, committed in swearing out a warrant against George Phillips and C. H. Murray before Hon. A. G. Brown, charging said defendants with being participants in a riot, when in fact neither of them had any knowledge of the transaction until after it was over. There is an element of no small proportions that should be taught to regard oaths as sacred, that property, liberty or life cannot be sworn away falsely and with impunity. The amount of contradictory evidence given in at least a large minority of cases tried is surprising, and it is fully time that the officers of the law do their duty in this matter and make perjury dangerous.

Died, at Empire City, December 24, 1880, Mrs. Emily Electa, wife of Hon. H. S. Hazard, aged 25 years, of consumption. Mrs. Hazard was born at Mount Scott, Douglas county, Oregon, on the 17th day of March, 1855, and was the daughter of James Watson, Esq., and a member of the highly respected family consisting of J. F., (Judge of this district), E. B., (Judge of Supreme Court), D. L., (ex-collector of customs), Robert, John, Charles, Miss E. E., Kate and Florence Watson and Mrs. S. Hamilton, (wife of Dr. Hamilton, of Roseburg). She visited her brother, D. L., in '74 and the climate here agreeing with her, she remained up to the time of her marriage with Hon. S. H. Hazard on July 3rd, 1876, and to the time of her death made Empire City her home. She was the mother of two children, the youngest of whom, only three months and eight days old, survive her.
