NEWS OF NEARBY TOWNS

SUSLAW FUND PROVIDED.

Port Commission Authorizes Issue of \$100,000 Bonds for Jetty.

FLORENCE, Or., Jan. 16.—The Commissioners of the Port of Siuslaw at their regular meeting voted to issue additional bonds to the sum of \$100,000. When the Port of Siuslaw was incorporated in 1909 plans for jetties at the mouth of the Siuslaw River were adopted and \$430,000 was raised for the purpose, bonds being sold by the Commission for \$215,000 and a like amount was appropriated by Congress. Contracts for this work were awarded and will be completed in about a year.

In order to secure the best results for a harbor from the jetty work it has been deemed necessary by the Government Engineers to extend the jetties farther out toward the ocean. For this additional improvement, at an estimated cost of \$206,000, steps are being taken and today's action by the Port Commissioners was for the purpose of providing its share. It is expected Congress will appropriate an equal amount. The Commissioners will await action by Congress before selling the bonds.

Few changes were made and the protest from Fairview against the reappointment of Stout was not considered sufficient cause to refuse him another term.

NOT PUBLISHED IN PAPER;

NOT PUBLIC, SAYS JUDGE.

The Cottage Grove Sentinel says: Holding that the notice of the sewer assessment had not been published in the papers and thus given sufficient publicity, Judge Harris last week decided in favor of the plaintiff in the case of Lea vs. Bartels to recover property sold for sewer assessment. The court decided that the notice should have been published in the newspapers as provided in the city charter, and that posting was not sufficient.

Mr. Lea was awarded the property, but was required to pay the assessment and interest. This case had been in the courts for some time.

Beginning at a point on the present harbor line and distant 3 1/2 degrees E. 639 feet from harbor line point No. 15, running thence north 1613.82 feet, to a point on the present harbor line which is distant N. 19 degrees 39 minutes E. 944.92 feet from the aforesaid point No. 15.

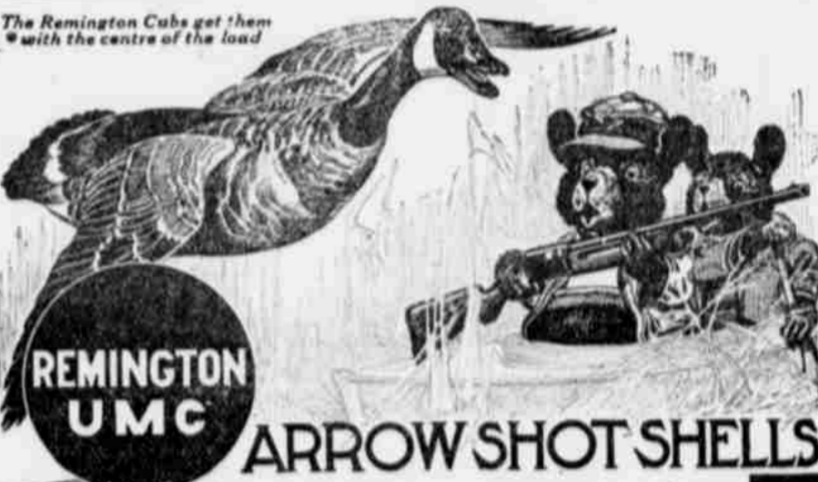
