

GOETHALS MAY BE A GOVERNOR

Garrison Submits Plan for Permanent Government in Panama Canal Zone

(By Associated Press to Coon Bay Times.)

WASHINGTON, D. C., Jan. 17.—Secretary Garrison has submitted to the President his plan for the permanent government of the Canal Zone. While the secretary would not disclose its features, it is understood it contemplated making Colonel George W. Goethals the first Governor of the zone with plenary powers and would create from retiring members of the Canal Commission a new commission to take charge of the ceremonies of the opening of the canal in January, 1915.
