## THE DROP-SHOULDER AND THE KIMONO SLEEVE EQUALLY MODISH

Every imaginable device is being used to bring about the broad effects now demanded by fashion. Yokes, drop-shoulders, raglan and kimono sleeves broaden the shoulders. The peg-top, panner and wired tunic widen the hips.

Mannish serge in dark blue is used in 8096. The blouse shows a very effective yoke, a wide armhole and a small round collar. The skirt is a peg-top, and for novelty, perhaps for use, there are two nifty little stitched pockets, one on each side of the front. Pockets appear wherever there is the slightest encouragement on tailored frocks and coats. They offer an effective finish. Size 36 in this design will require 4 3/4 yards of 36 inch material. No. 8050-7737 is a costume of dull terra-cotta cloth with an inset vest in which there is just a touch of old blue. The blouse is one of those new coat blouses in peasant design with a circular pleat; the skirt shows just a few folds of drapery on each side of the panel. To copy this costume in size 36 it requires 2 3/4 yards of 42 inch material for the blouse (8050) and 3 3/4 yards of 42 inch material for the skirt in size 36.
