BIG SLAUGHTER BY VARMINTS

Four Panther Kill Nine Deer in Two Weeks—Fishways Are Ordered

Deputy Game Warden Jas. Thomas has just returned from the headwaters of the South Fork of the Coquille and during the trip had it clearly demonstrated how destructive varmints are to the wild game. Mr. Warner is a brother-in-law of Carl Albrecht of Marshfield. He missed some calves and started hunting for them and found the carcasses of nine deer, all of which had been killed within two weeks. He got his dogs and started trailing the varmints and soon bagged the four, but was unable to find three panther kittens.

SENATOR JONES OPPOSES PLAN

CONTENDS GOVERNMENT OWNERSHIP OF STEAMSHIP LINES IS NOT REQUIRED—COMPETITION WILL LOWER RATES.

(By Associated Press to Coos Bay Times.) WASHINGTON, D. C., Jan. 19.—Speaking of the Alaska Railroad bill today, Senator Jones, of Washington, contended that Government steamship lines should not also be provided, because the companies would have to meet the Government on equal terms. The rates of the steamship, which would have to come to a common port, he held, could be regulated with reasonable satisfaction. Under such conditions, he thought there would be such sharp competition that reasonable rates would be insured. If monopoly should develop, he said he would then favor the extension of the Government railroad to the ownership and operation of steamship lines. He doubted the wisdom or necessity of taking such action now, however. Discussing the best method of developing and operating the mines to which the proposed railroad would give access, he said he thought a fair leasing system that would prevent monopoly, could be devised, but that he would not shrink from Government operation of mines if that seemed best.

COOS BAY IS AGAIN LEADING

LEADS EVERY PORT ON THE PACIFIC COAST IN SHIPMENTS OF FIR AND SPRUCE TO THE SAN FRANCISCO MARKET.

Coos Bay led every other port on the North Pacific Coast in the shipments of fir and spruce to the San Francisco market during the period December 29, 1913, to January 19, 1914, by close to a million feet, Aberdeen being the nearest competitor with 860,000 feet less. Coos Bay harbor was third and the Columbia River fourth. The shipments of fir, spruce and redwood received at San Francisco during the period mentioned were as follows: Fir and Spruce, Aberdeen 4,140,000, Bellingham 350,000, Bandon 930,000, Columbia River 1,910,000, Coos Bay 5,040,000, Mukilteo 1,050,000, Port Ludlow 600,000, Tacoma 650,000, Willapa 2,130,000, Total 17,150,000. Redwood, Eureka 4,570,000, Fort Bragg 2,090,000, Caspar 320,000, Mendocino 620,000, Greenwood 1,050,000, Crescent City 310,000, Total 9,340,000.
