

SHORTER DAYS AND BETTER WAGES FOR WOMEN AFTER FEBRUARY 7 ORDERED BY INDUSTRIAL COMMISSION.

A considerable number of Coos Bay stores and business houses will be affected by the following notice which has just been issued: The Industrial Welfare Commis-

sion of the State of Oregon hereby orders that:

No person, firm or corporation shall employ any experienced, adult woman in any industry in the State of Oregon, paid by time rate of pay-ment, at a weekly wage rate of less ment, at a weekly wage rate of less than eight dollars and twenty-five cents (\$8.25) a week, any lesser amount being hereby declared inade-quate to supply the necessary cost of living to such women workers and to maintain them in health.

Nor shall any person, firm or corporation employ women in any industry in the State of Oregon for more than fifty-four (54) hours a week. Nor shall any such person, firm


or corporation pay inexperienced, adult women workers employed by time rate of payment, at a rate of wages less than six dollars (\$6.00) a week. And the maximum length of time such workers may be considered inexperienced in any industry shall not exceed one year.

No person, firm or corporation owning or conducting any mercanowning or conducting any mercan-tile, manufacturing or laundry es-tablishment in the State of Oregon shall employ women workers in such establishments later than the hour of eight-thirty (8:30) o'clock p. m. of any day. This hour of dismis-sal does not apply to telephone and telegraph companies, confectionery establishments, restaurants and ho-tels, nor does this order apply to night workers. night workers. Said order shall become effective

from and after February 7, 1914. After such order is effective, it shall be unlawful for any employer In the state of Oregon affected thereby to fall to observe and com-ply therewith, and any person who violates said order shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof, shall be punish-ed by a fine of not less than twenty-five dollars (\$25) nor more than one hundred dollars (\$100) or by imprisonment in the county jail for not less than ten days nor more than three months, or by both such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the court.

Chamber of Commerce of the United States of America during the past three months by the election of the Chamber of Commerce of Astoria and the Emblem Club of Bend. Six Oregon organizations are now members of the National Chamber.

There are now 488 organizations constituting the membership of the National Chamber. Every state and territory is represented with the ex-ception of New Mexico. Commercial organizations in Hawaii, Porto Rico and the Philippine Islands have been elected. The American Chamber of Commerce in Paris, and the American Chamber of Commerce for the Levant are also members.

The second annual meeting of the National Chamber will be held in Washington from February 11 to 13. Several hundred business men, representative of commercial organiza-tions, are expected. February 12 will be devoted to the broadest consideration of all that is involved in the Sherman anti-trust law and the regulation of corporate activity by law. The annual banquet of the National Chamber will be held on the anniversary of President Lincoln's birthday On February 11 Secretary Wilson of the Department of Labor, will ad dress the meeting on "The Relation of the Department of Labor to Industries and Commerce.

MAY INCREASE WEIGHT LIMIT.

Parcels Weighing 100 Pounds May Soon Re Shipped Through Mails.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Jan. 30. Recent investigations with a view to increasing the weight limit of the parcels post have proven so success-ful that parcels weighing 100 pounds may soon be shipped by mail. Postmay soon be shipped by mail. master General Burleson is giving the scheme serious consideration and is The to be in favor of it. known weight limit of parcels at present is 50 pounds.

"The 100-pound weight limit has no terrors for me," the Postmaster General declared. He expressed the belief that 600 million parcels would be transported through the mails during the year beginning July 1 next, with a revenue of approximately ten cents each.
